



SECTION-I

Puthimari College: A Brief Profile

Puthimari College, a premier institution of higher education in Puthimari area was established on August 5, 1981. The establishment of the college is the outcome of the effort vanguard people of the area because the people felt that the people of the greater Puthimari area had been deprived of access to higher education owing to the absence of higher educational institution in the locality. Thanks to the initiative taken by the enthusiastic people of the area, for setting up of the college by the bank of the river Puthimari that comes forward to fulfill the long-felt thirst for higher education for the young generation. Presently, the academic activities of the institution widen beyond the territory of the district. It is now acknowledged as one of the pioneers of higher education in Assam. Meanwhile, the College has attained "B" grade in NAAC Re- accreditation in 2023. Moreover, the college is also ISO 9001 2015 certified institute.

The college stands at Soneswar by the Puthimari River in the district of Kamrup(R). It is 40 kms to the north of Guwahati, the capital of Assam. 31 No. National Highway connects the college by a PWD road at Baihata. It is situated in a sylvan area with the Puthimari River in the west and Alta village in the cast.

The college has enough provisions for class rooms, departments, well equipped library and student union hall etc. The college has also sufficient provisions for games and sports for the students and several committees to cater to the needs for all round development of the students as well as the community. It has set up a digital classroom and e-learning room to facilitate the students with the taste of knowledge worldwide. The college has limited hostel facilities for girl students. The college is likely to open new streams like science, commerce as well as vocational courses.

FYUGP - AT A GLANCE

As per UGC's curriculum Framework (November2022) based on National education Policy (NEP) 2020, Guwahati university has designed FYUGP (Four Year Under Graduate Programme) and that has been already implemented from the session 2023-2024. AccordinglyPuthimari college has already introduced FYUGP in Arts stream in the 2023 -2024 session.

Salient Features

Duration : Under the NEP FYUGP, it is a four year degree programme spread across & stream.

Programme and Exits:

A student can attain certificate, degree or diploma in completing the course and requirements in any year :

- a) After 1 year A certificate subject to the completion of one extra skill course.
- b) After 2 years A diploma subject to the one extra skill course.
- c) After 3 year 1) Bachelor Degree with major
 - 2) Bachelor Degree without major or 3 minors.
- d) After 4 Years Bachelor Degree (Honors) or Bachelor Degree with Research.

Curricular Components:

- a) Core Courses
- i. Major Course (60credit = 15 Papers)
- ii. Minor course (12credits = 3 papers)

A student can choose one major and one minor or 2 minors from the options offered by the college.

A student need not choose major in declaring one of the core subjects as major in 3rd semester.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE (ONLINE)

HS FIRST YEAR

Students can take admission to H.S. 1st Year in Arts stream of Puthimari College by registering themselves in the DARPAN portal of AHSEC (https://darpan.ahseconline.in/). The date of admission will be notified in the Darpan Portal. Students have to be physically present in the college for verification of documents and fee payment, upon which admission will be confirmed.

FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

- > A candidate shall apply for admission through the Assam State Higher Education Admission Portal-SAMARTH PORTAL ONLY (https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in). The link will be available on the college website as well to register and proceed with the further application process.
- > Students will be selected for admission strictly on merit.
- The College follows the government rules of reservation for admission of the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC.
- A few seats are also reserved for physically handicapped students and for the students having outstanding achievements in sports, cultural field and NCC.
- > Free studentship will be offered as per the Assam Government prescribed guideline.

Renewal of Admission:

- a) Students are required renew their admission in H.S. 2nd Year, B.A. 3rd Semester and B.A. 5th Semester within June every year. (The stipulated date will be announced by the Principal)
- b) Students are required to renew their identity card in H.S. 2nd Year, B.A. 3rd Semester and B.A. 5 th Semester within June every year.

Document in origin to be produced at the time of counseling and admission:

(a) Mark sheet of the last qualifying examination.



- (b) Transfer certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
- (c) Caste certificate in case of OBC, MOBC, SC, and ST applicants.
- (d) Students passing the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- (e) One copy of passport size (not attested) photograph for identity card.

FEES STUCTURE: Fees will be as prescribed by the Directorate of Higher Education

Date of commencement of H.S. and B.A. classes will be announced on the date of admission. Students' Academic Card and Calendar and Daily Class Routine will also be distributed among the students on the same day.

SECTION VII

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR MAINTAINANCE OF DISCIPLENE OF STUDENT

A. A minimum attendance of 75% is compulsory for a student to appear in Council and University Examinations as per instruction.

The IQAC not only prepares annual qualitative reports, which is a compilation of departmental profiles, academic and co-curricular activities, and student progress, to be sent to NAAC, but the cell also sets standards for research and teaching. At the same time, it guides departments by organizing capacity building seminars for faculties.

Besides the IQAC, the college administration has an efficient academic management team lead by a coordinator, and which maintains a check on quality of academic activities of the college.

Students Empowerment

The college accords highest regards for students' empowerment. Students are allowed to form a union in a democratic way and as per the guidelines of Supreme Court, to take part in decision making processes. A minimum attendance of 75% is compulsory for a student to contest in the Students' Union elections.

Publication

Puthimari College boasts of having its own ISSN numbered, peer reviewed research journal named "Concept". It is published yearly, and it attempts to maintain a strong quality check of its features.

The student community of the also college publishes an annual magazine called "Puthimarian" by which they express their budding creativity. Moreover, some of the departments also publish their own departmental magazines where student contributions are a must.



Future Plan

The College has planned to open science and commerce departments to increase its outreach. At the same time, various vocational and diploma courses have already been introduced in the college. The administration also plans to develop its existing ICT and sports infrastructure to make it a central hub for both in Sonesar and its surrounding areas.

Activities for Physical and mental fitness

The College provides facilities which are commonly necessary for physical and mental fitness of the student. Games and sports activities are regularly performed under the guideship of a teacher- in-charge. The college also holds its own sports week. The college playground often hosts football, volley ball and badminton matches along with athletic competitions. Apart from this, Yoga day is also observed to promotehealth care of the students.

Book Bank facility

The college has a book bank facility. The book bank lends books to meritorious students from poor financial background. Students willing to avail themselves of this facility should apply to the librarian in prescribed formats available at the library.

Scholarship

The College distributes different national and state scholarships time to time, as per rules laid down by the government.

Awards

For the academic encouragement of the students, two cash awards are offered annually by the College authorities to the best graduate and the best H.S. scholar of the college. Moreover various departments confer special awards to toppers of BA final year examination of their respective departments.

Students' Aid Fund

The college provides financial assistance to the students hailing from poor economic backgrounds. Eligible students shall have to apply to the Principal stating his/her economic background along with a certificate from the Gaon Burah or Mauzadar of the locality and a photocopy of the ration card of the family.

Internet & Printing Facility

Internet and printing facility is available in the College free of cost for all members of the College family as urgency demands.

Boys' and Girls' Common Room

There are separate Common rooms for boys and girls. The students may engage in recreational activities with the available equipments.



SECTION IX

EXTENSION SERVICES & SOCIETIES

Following the guidelines of the UGC and in pursuit of the mission of maintaining the college as an excellent institute of higher education, it has formed various cells and societies which are responsible for maintaining academic and student discipline, while providing extension services for student and teacher welfare

They are as follows:

IQAC

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Puthimari College, was established on January 03, 2005 in order to ensure quality education in the institution. It is, as in any other institution of higher education in India now, expected to sustain and even enhance the academic and research standards of the college. Keeping the above in mind, the cell has endeavored to develop a system that aims at a catalytic, yet consistent academic growth in the college. Thus, the cell is expected to make the institution fit to survive with glory in the world of education, which is already ringed with cut-throat competition.

Women's Cell

The Women's Cell of the college addresses the issues and problems related to woman and girls in the college. The cell constantly organizes awareness campaigns, related to female hygiene, domestic violence and legal rights of women in the college and nearby areas. It also organizes seminars on gender sentivization and educational empowerment of women. The cell regularly observes International Woman's Day every year on 8th March.

NCC and NSS Wings

Puthimari College has an active NCC wing under 30 Assam Battalion with a capacity of sixty four cadets. The wing has been active since October, 2017. The cadets have been actively taking part in regular classes and all other social service based activities and camps. The cadets of the college have so far completed eight camps organized in Changsari (2018), Umroi (Meghalaya, 2018), Amingaon (2019, 2019) and Narangi (2022, 2022, 2023, 2023).



The college also has an active NSS wing which performs regular activities through its volunteers within and outside the campus. For the greater interest of the community, the unit adopts a village every year for their overall welfare, and special camp is organized by the wing for one week.

Extension Education Centre

There is an Extension Education Centre in the college. The objective of the centre is to provide teaching and other extension activities at nearby schools of the locality. The center first opened in 2016 when it adopted the Azara village, a nearby village to provide teaching activities. From then, this center has regularly engaged in such activities in numerous villages and schools. This center deploys both students and faculties to conduct the activities. A part of the funds for this center comes from the main college fund, while donations are always welcome.

Information and Career Guidance Cell

There are is an Information and Career Guidance cell of the College that the students can avail. This cell engages different professionals and speakers to bring career guidance to the students at the college. Furthermore, other information regarding higher education, application fill-up, job opportunities are also collected and distributed to students on a regular basis.

Student's Union

The college has a democratically elected Students' Union which handles the various affairs of students, relating to co-curricular and even extension activities. Elections are held as per academic calendar every year. Authority makes arrangements for free and fair election in the college campus.

Grievance and Redressal Cell

The college authority has established a Grievances & Redressal Cell in order to receive complaints from the students, guardians and other stake holders in the college. The complaints received are meted out by the competent cell as per the existing norms.

Alumni

The institution has an alumni association since 2002. Alumni association of the college has rendered a prominent role in keeping the college informed of alumni achievements, while also contributing in growth of the college through various financial and non-financial aids.


